Child Sexual Abuse Material (CSAM)

- The term “child pornography” is currently used in federal statutes and is defined as any visual depiction of sexually explicit conduct involving a person less than 18 years old.
- While this phrase still appears in federal law, “child sexual abuse material” is preferred, as it better reflects the abuse that is depicted in the images and videos and the resulting trauma to the child.

NCMEC Data (2023)

National Center for Missing and Exploited Children

- Total of 36,210,368 reports
 - 35,925,098 (99%) CSAM related
 - 32,951,434 (91%) resolved to locations outside of U.S.
 - 186,819 “online enticement” for sexual acts of a child
 - 63,077 unsolicited obscene material sent to a child

- Yahoo Boys (West African cyber-criminals) targeting English-speaking minors through Instagram, Snapchat, and Wizz
 - Sextortion instructional videos available on TikTok, YouTube, and Scribd
- Financial Sextortion is the fastest growing crime

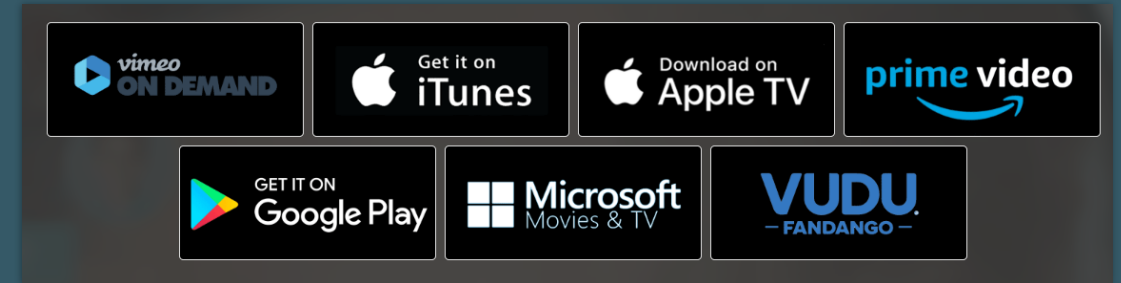
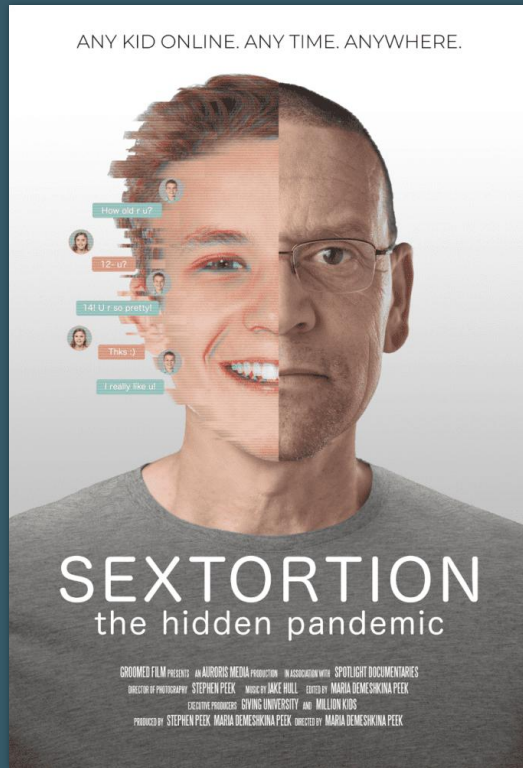

Prevention

- Be curious
- Never assume they will talk with us
- Talk about what is appropriate to share online
- Connect before correct
- Disengage



What if...

- Tell your parents, teacher(s), or trusted adult(s)
- Be honest about what's been shared
- Stop communication immediately
- Start documenting
- Do not delete any evidence
- Don't tell the perpetrator that you're calling the police
- Make a police report



Warning Signs

- Emotional, angry, agitated, or aggressive outbursts
- Change in behavior
- Attempts to conceal online activity
- Hidden social media accounts
- Spending excessive amounts of time online



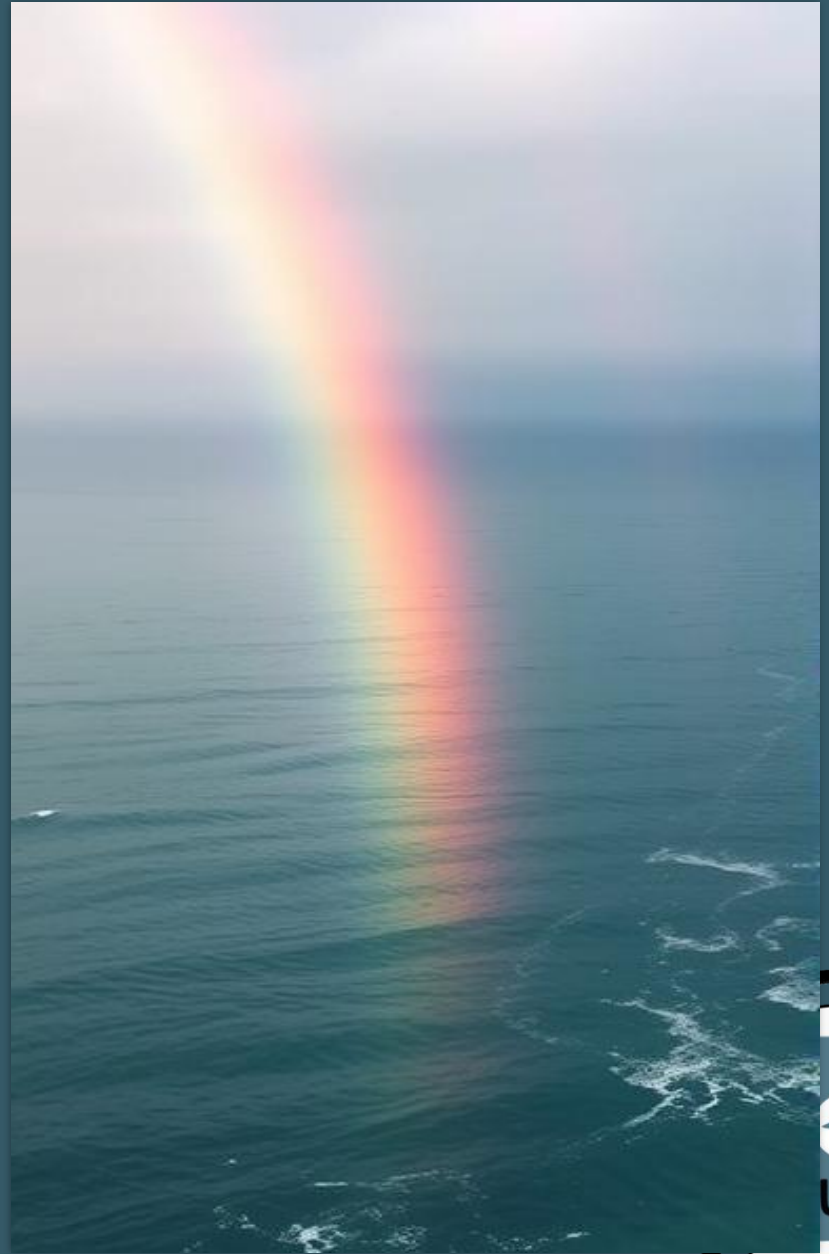

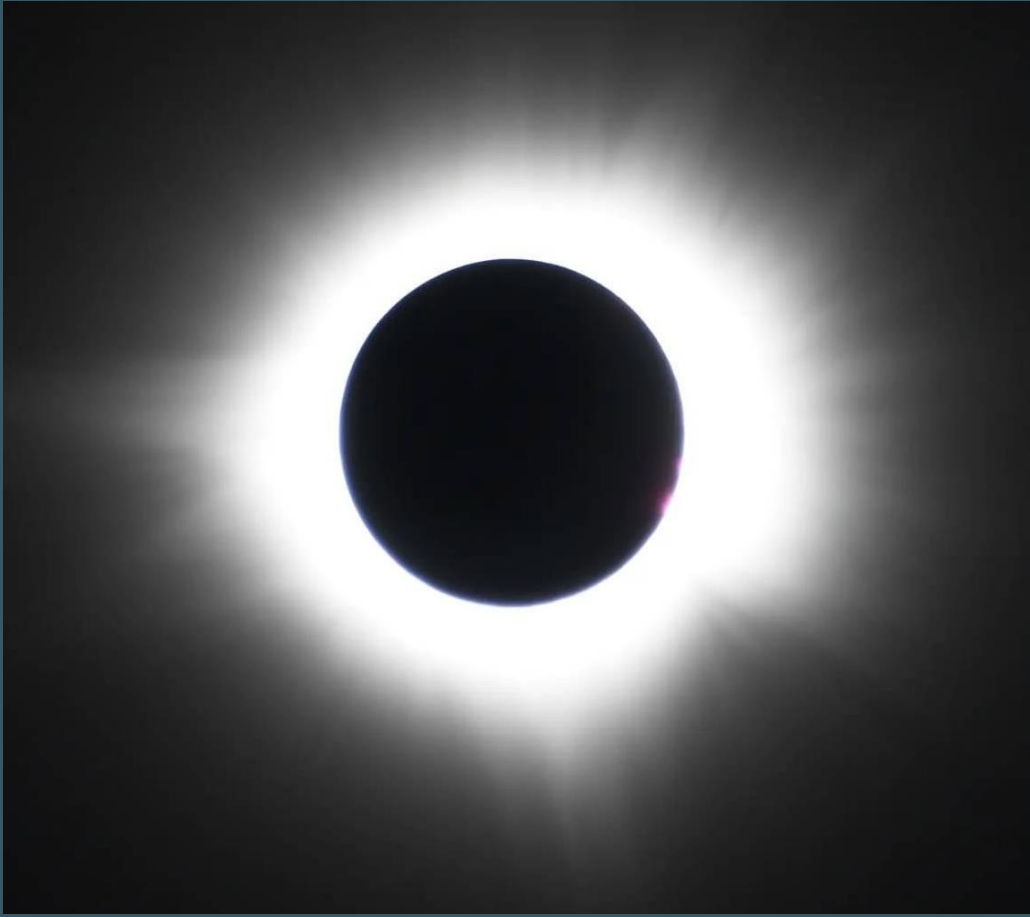
